

LETTER OF INTEREST: COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CONSERVATORIO STATALE DI MUSICA “LUIGI BOCCHERINI” OF LUCCA AND THE MOZARTEUM UNIVERSITY OF SALZBURG

The Conservatorio Statale di Musica “Luigi Boccherini” of Lucca, located in Piazza del Suffragio 6, 55100 Lucca (Italy), represented by the Director, M^o Massimo Morelli, born in Livorno (LI) on August 3, 1958, and the Mozarteum University of Salzburg, located at Mirabellplatz 1, 5020 Salzburg (Austria), represented by the Rector Prof. Dr. Constanze Wimmer, born in Vienna_on ,

WHEREAS

- there is mutual interest in developing educational, artistic, and cultural collaborations;
- both institutions share the goal of promoting exchanges between students, faculty, and academic structures;
- there has been a positive experience gained through previous joint initiatives;

AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1 – Duration

This agreement shall have a duration of three years from the date of signature and may be renewed upon mutual agreement between the parties.

Article 2 – Objectives

The undersigned institutions commit to developing joint activities in the fields of music education, artistic production, and international mobility, particularly through:

1. The **“La Bella Musica” project**, which in the calendar year 2025 involved the participation of 7 students from the Conservatorio “L. Boccherini” in training and artistic activities at the Mozarteum University and also 2027.

2. **Faculty exchanges**, especially in the areas of voice, stagecraft, and piano accompaniment, through the organization of lessons and masterclasses hosted alternately by the two institutions;
3. **Joint artistic productions**, involving students and faculty from both institutions;
4. **Internship opportunities** for students at the respective partner institutions;
5. **Promotion of Erasmus+ mobility**, for both students and faculty, within the framework of European Commission-funded programs;
6. Designing cultural projects to promote **the heritage of both partner institutions' libraries**.

Article 3 – Implementation

Activities will be planned annually through exchanges of communication between the two institutions, which will define organizational details, selection procedures, and any financial arrangements.

Article 4 – Confidentiality Obligations

The Parties acknowledge the confidential nature of any information exchanged under this Agreement and undertake:

- not to disclose, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, in any form, any confidential information received from the other Party;
- not to use any confidential information, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, for purposes other than those defined by this Agreement.

The Parties will identify case by case the information deemed confidential, the disclosure of which must be authorized in writing.

These confidentiality obligations shall remain in effect even after the expiration of this Agreement.

Article 5 – Data Protection

The Parties mutually commit to processing and storing personal data and information obtained during the execution of this Agreement in accordance with the principles of lawfulness, fairness, and transparency, as established by the General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 2016/679 – “GDPR”) and Italian Legislative Decree no. 196/2003, as amended.

In particular, the Parties shall:

- ensure compliance with safeguards for data subjects through appropriate technical and organizational measures;
- provide mutual assistance in responding to data subject requests under Articles 15–22 of the GDPR;
- cooperate in any required data protection impact assessments under Article 35 of the GDPR;
- respond to requests for cooperation from the supervisory authority under Article 31 of the GDPR.

Should the processing under this Agreement involve the transfer of personal data to third countries, the transferring Party shall inform the other Party and ensure compliance with Articles 44–49 of the GDPR. Both Parties declare that the data provided or collected, even verbally, will be processed lawfully and fairly solely for the purposes of this Agreement and in compliance with applicable legislation.

Any data disclosure will only occur under the specific circumstances permitted by the Regulation. Each Party also guarantees the exercise of the rights under Sections 2, 3, and 4 of the GDPR and acknowledges that failure to provide data may prevent the execution of this Agreement.

Article 6 – Signature and Registration

This Agreement is drafted and signed in digital form pursuant to Article 15, paragraph 2-bis, of Law 241/1990. Registration will be carried out, if necessary, by the interested Party and only in case of use.

Article 7 – Language

This Agreement is written in both Italian and English. Both versions are equally valid.
